Feets walks past my window. Every day she tap-tap-taps down that sidewalk and up to the front door of the building like she just bought and paid for it.

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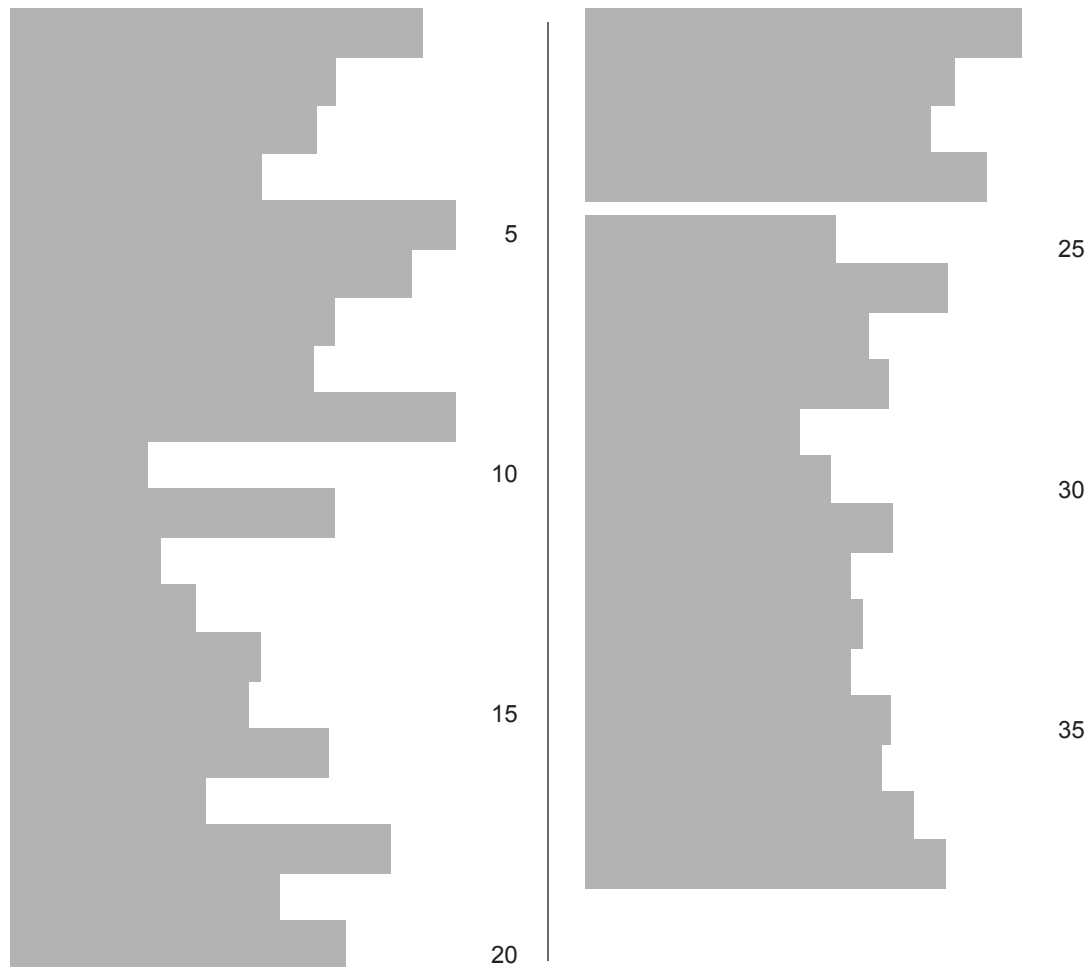
Bet he never picks his nose again.
