Jerome was specifically given traits to become a gold medal swimmer. Babies concieved naturally are referred to as in-valids and descrimination is now based off DNA, not skin

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colour, as vincent says we now have discrimination down to a science. This mirrors societies fears at the time of IVF," designer bables At the time this film was made the first IFV baby was born, healthy and perfect. People became scared that scientists would be able to give children certain traits, instead of just screening for illnen, and began arguing the ethics of idesigner bables? was It right to engineer your child to be a scientist, put all that presure on them? What if they didn't like science? Or wanted to be a teacher instead? Gattica explored thus fear and gave people a place to work out how they fett.

Minority Report, a 2002 film directed by steven Spielberg looks at a fear of technology and invasion of privacy following 9/11 and the P.A.T.K. 10. T act. In the film John Anderson works in pre-crime, a division that can see crimes before they happen and interviens to stop them, arresting the suspect for cfutures crimes before they are committed. After Anderson and his tam stop a man from killing his wife, he says () haven't done anything yet!" This looks at free will vs pre-determinism, did they he kill his wife because pre-drime saw him do it, or did they see him do it because he killed his wife? In Minovity Report advertisements read your retinal scan and specify advertisements towards you and your preter's purchase history, at this time technology in society was evolving and newdays web browsers track theor sites you visit and tailor advertisements to you. Minority heport also looks at imasion of privacy

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with the pre-cogs seeing things, and the spyders. In the movie we see the spyders deployed into an apartment building, looking for John, the spyders job is to scan the retinal of everyone in the building to make sure John isn't there is or is not there. They go through, interupt intimate moments, and have no regard for peoples privacy or emotional state. This relates to the P.A.T.R.I.O.T. act, a bill that allows the FBI to monitor peoples mail, emails, phone bills, hack their phones, watch the non through city compras. At the time peop this movie was released in cinemas people were scared and angry about the government spying on them, and minority kepuit expressed this fear and anger.

Surrogates, the 2009 film directed by Joseph W\_ took at a fear of technology and social media. In the film people no longer leave their homes, instead they use robols (called surrogates), they connect their brains to a machine at home and live through their robot. This reflects peoples fear of technology taking over their lives, as people now interact through their surrogates, this relates to their fear that social media, texting, Skypeing, instant messaging, is going to make human interaction irrelevant, careless, cruel, encouraging vs to behave like robots.

Elysium, the 2012 film directed by David Blomkamp looks at our fear of over population and global warming / poverty. In Elysium humans have killed the Earth, most animals are extinct, and the rich have fled to live on a

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ASSESSOR'S Space ship that orbits Earth, called Elysium. This the Earth became so over populated we ran out of resources, we killed the Earth. This relates back to our fear of overpopulation and the idea that the Earth can only support 56 many life forms at any given time.

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these movies we see the themes adapt as societies fears adapt, allowing them to stay relevant to society, as what scares us also interests us. It is important for the themes within these movies to evolve and adapt because they're a viencle for social commentary and they need to adapt to survive and stay relevant to society as it changed
