When the fear and concerns change in a society, so does a media genre. I believe that psychological oriented horrors heed to change to fit these concerns in order to be successful. Pschological oriented horror is a specific type of horor that relevite heavily on ambiguity and implied horror to scare the audience. Through Examples such as creating doors and jump scares play on the characters fear and connects the audience to the characters emotionally as it heightens their emotions to scare them. Ambiguity and Implied horror nate a psych horror film work and it has changed and has reinvented itself to lit the needs of society.

Regulating cal oriented himself were created when people the world was at war. During would war 2 (1939-1945), and hences didn't want to see graphic images on the screen but still marted to scare themselves. At the same time, a radio show called Lights Out shorted by those studios used simple humbald objects to make andiences feel meany and 'grossed out'. A nursist, Val Lendon was inspired by this and took it upon himself to produce a number of films that would be the brankthrough four the genre. The two films that would be revolutionary for homor and would create psychological homor was 1942's (at people and 1943's the Leopard man, both directed by Jasques tourness.

Cat leaple was the first movie to use ambiguity and implied humar to scare the andience. A good example of this is a scere where a character, Alice is trightened by a sound of a cat and jumps into a pool. It is very still and there is no music, furthernor adding to the cerie feel of the seen. Suddenly, the cendience vagnely ratches a glimpre of a shadow finde across the wall and converse around the room. We also has a loud pontler growl as Alice screams. Although we cannot see the partler, through the we of Antigrity Tourner made is believe that there was a dangerous animal in the room with het. This connects us to Alice as we become concerned for her safter. The next ancijus scene that relies on antignity to some andiences is a Scere where Alice it walking down a dark alteger street. Once again because there is no music, it makes the scene leve and creepy. We start to hear footstops behind her and start to beal anany about the situation. Suddenly there is a loud hiss. For a morent we think it might be the big cold but thankfully it was a bus. The use of ambiguity for fat Rople works well in heighting our emotions and connects as to characters, that is why it was the start of a suscessful line of psych homors.

The next more that relies howing on arobiguity and implied horror to scar andiences and top into the characters fears is The Leopard Man, (1943). This movie only had a bodget of \$150,000 that is why ambiguity and implied herry made the movie work. A scene that is both drawatic and tense is a scene where a going girl gets sent to the store at night. On his way back, she stambles across a dork bridge. The only made digetic sound we have is a state top or drain dropping. Because thre is no movie the director makes us focus on the dian dropping and it makes as feel concerned as the characters starts to get scened. Suddenly I a lond

grow revents a partler storm at her. It is hidden in the shadows and we feel very uptight about what is going to unfold. The young girl starts to run, being chased by the purtler she runs all the way home. But the door is locked and all the audience oran do is far the rust. Her scenning stops as blood seeps under the door and it is implied that she is killed by the parther. This is a very effective example of implied horror, where he don't need to see the monster to be affected emitionally about the situation.

Then the psych horrors started to charge as did the fear and concerns of dudiences. Prectors started to try and frank out.

And iences by using over the top presteties and gave Examples like left Jackson's Braindard and Bad Faste are good examples of the use of gave and the term 'splatter firm' was created. But it was not what the andiences were locking for and the hurror genes started to feal away as addiences moved to other genes, such as soil, western and remance. But there was a film that was released in 1949 that would bring back paych burgers and change the hurror genes forever:

That movie bear the blair witch project, directed by Edward Function and Daniel Myrick. It was a strategic nationing take that was telling andiences that the action in the film died while raking a documentary, and that the stage their type was found. Andiences actually be lieved it and studied to got back into horrors. The film brought back the use of ambiguity and implied horror to scare and jences. In one scare, the group of toe raggers finds mysterious stick figures hanging from the trees. We don't know who, or what put then there that and it starts to scare us that there might be something watching them. The Chapacters are confused, so is the eductions and that is why the scare is

effective in carety for these Characters. Blair witch brought teach that has so successful back in Lewtons films and remembed the horror gence by bringing back old techniques that budged so well on andiences in the 40's. It also showed that it is entremly easy for amater filmakes to break into the film industry by making pych horror films, as they do not require tots of special effects or gon-Blair witch also inspired 2001's smarthit Parenamal Auctivity directed by over

There are many implications of watching a psychological horror. Became the horror is implied and not shown, andiences have the apparetunity to imagine the number in their head, so it sticks not them in their head and makes them return to the firm. Another implication is sleep distances and nightness. Became psych horrors use combiguity (e.g. creaking doors) when we have those sounds in our own homes at night we put overeller in the characters shows and cloud to feel like we are being watched. It wesses with our beache so that even a small sound can make as jump the final implication is cathetic release. Cathetic release is going to a movie with the expectation of being sound than engaging in a scene before the lights one buck on and suddenly governot alone anymore. It is good for the fibration became it there give an dience catherlic release to will do not not and noke a lot of money.

So in conducion, toychological oriented horrors need to change borded on the fears and conterns of the andience. They heeds to kinvent itself by directors coming up with new ideas and findings ways for it to be sussessful. Through the vie of implied horror and and junity it can give and iences what they wonk and it can keep than coming book.
