"// Virginia Busch's point of view is shaped by ter perspective as a non-profit worker rentroducing species back to the wild, and ter ideology of censervatism and environmentalist. Although she and Dro Parter both have a conservationist point of view, they differ in their beliefs of what kind of approach works best, Virginia Busch clearly preferning 2005. 1/ This could be because she values the way zoos con work as places to engage with and inspire the community, as well as being places of research and conservation, whereas Dr. Parke just values the conservation part of 2005, when there is in fact, many only parts to them.
